Uncompromising standards.

Every single bag of rice is carefully inspected for safety and taste.

As the world's first action, inspections for radioactive materials are conducted on every single bag of rice produced in Fukushima. Only those foods that have been certified for safety can be found on the market. No rice, vegetables, fruits, meat, or seafood produced in 2015 exceeded the Standard Limits on radioactive substances.

In Japan, inspections of radioactive substances based on the strictest level in the world are carried out. (Bq/kg)
